Dear Clover Hill Family,

This Fall we'll be spending some time in the Gospel of Luke. Luke is one of the synoptics gospels. While Matthew, Mark, and Luke all have unique features, they share many of the same stories about Jesus. They often share these stories in a similar order with very similar wording. Because of their shared perspectives they are often referred to as the synoptic gospels (the word "synoptic" comes from the Greek word *synoptikos*, which means "able to be seen together").

In his magisterial book on the parables of Jesus, Robert Capon sees the feeding of the multitude (Matthew 14:13-21; Mark 6:31-44; Luke 9:12-17) as marking a turning point in the ministry and mindset of Jesus:

It seems to me that from the Feeding of the Five Thousand on, he had a much firmer grip on the truth that the Messiah was not going to save the world by miraculous, Band-Aid interventions: a storm calmed here, a crowd fed there, a mother-in-law cured back down the road. Rather, it was going to be saved by means of a deeper, darker, left-handed mystery, at the center of which lay his own death... In any case, it is only after the Feeding that his talk about dying actually begins. In Luke it starts a mere three verses later, at 9:2.

As Jesus talks more about his own death in his teachings and in his parables, we learn what Christian faith really is, according to Capon:

What saves us is Jesus, and the way we lay hold of that salvation is by faith. And faith is something that, throughout this book, I shall resolutely refuse to let mean anything other than trusting Jesus. It is simply saying yes to him rather than no. It is, at its root, a mere "uh-huh" to him personally. It does not necessarily involve any particular theological structure or formulation; it does not entail any particular degree of emotional fervor; and above all, it does not depend on any specific repertoire of good works - physical, mental, or moral. It's Just "Yes, Jesus," till we die - just letting the power of his resurrection do, in our deaths, what it has already done in his.

It's several chapters after Jesus begins this emphasis in his ministry that we pick up the story. What we'll find is that we continue to be invited to trust him, dying to ourselves so that we can rise with him.



Front Entrance Project Update

We have now received one bid for the front entrance project. This contractor said it would be approximately \$22,000. He said that it could be a little more or a little less once he got inside of it to see what the structure is like. He also said he would not be able to schedule anything until next year. We have reached out to other contractors who are all quite busy and have not yet been able to look at our project.

In the meantime, the short term fixes to the hinges are working and we need to raise the money to pay for this project. We are using \$22,000 as our fundraising goal number, while we seek out more bids. The Pig Roast proceeds this year will be split between the Building Fund and the For the Doors Fund. We have collected \$2600 in donations so far this year "For the Doors." That \$2600 is about 12% of our goal.

Going forward, we will update you with the fundraising progress each month with our "For the Doors" progress graph.

Disbursement Process

For items purchased for Church use, congregation members should get prior approval from a member of the Stewardship Team before making a purchase they intend to seek reimbursement for.

For items congregation members wish to purchase and donate, they may choose to use the Disbursement form and note it as a donation. Disbursement will be made with the understanding that the check will be part of the Sunday offering. This will document the donation for tax purposes.

The Stewardship Team can approve up to \$500 for an individual purchase or collectively up to \$500 for a calendar month without Consistory specific approval. Over \$500 must be approved by Consistory.


