Seating

Seating on the right side of the sanctuary is unrestricted. Seating on the left side will remain socially distanced as indicated by red and green placards.

Mask Use

Sanctuary: mask use remains optional.

Ventilation

On cold days, we will conserve heat by leaving windows closed. (This is a change from last winter when we continued to ventilate the sanctuary regardless of the temperature.)

If you have had a known COVID exposure, please take appropriate precautions including wearing a high-quality mask when you are around other people. Dear Clover Hill,

We had a busy January together! We held two congregational conversations and a congregational meeting. I'm so grateful for the depth of reflection that occurred at each of these gatherings. If you missed the conversations, go to YouTube.com for the following videos:

Some of that reflection has been about the option to close, to sell, and to invest differently. But the vast majority of the reflection has been about who we are as a church, how we got here, and what is growing within us or around us.

As I move into my second year with you? In this next year, I see my primary responsibility to be nurturing our interior and exterior lives so that we, individually and collectively, are faithful in following Jesus.

Clover Hill is a vibrant, faithful community of faith. This past month, some have asked me for reading material or online resources to learn and grow their faith. Check out this list of resources for you individually: <u>Devotional Ideas 2023.</u>

For us collectively, the next three weeks, I'm doing a series on "What did Jesus say?", looking at the Sermon on the Mount in Matthew 5-8. And then for Lent, we'll move into a series, "What stories did Jesus tell?", focusing on five parables in Matthew's gospel. Alongside the Lent sermon series, we will gather to study the Spiritual Disciplines that aid our spiritual growth.

I look forward to all of this with you!



Coffee with Jesus



Message from the Pastoral Search Team

Search Team Update:

As the search team continues the process which will lead to bringing a part time pastor to Clover Hill Reformed Church, this is a good time to understand what this will mean for both the congregation and the candidate for pastor.

Chapter 5 in The Calling of a Part Time Pastor discusses mutual expectations of a congregation and a part time pastor. The congregation should expect that the pastor be a person of strong character, sense God's calling to the ministry, will believe and preach the word of God, be a person of prayer, love the people of the church, provide pastoral care, lead, train people for ministry, agree upon duties and expectations of the ministry.

There are also expectations that a part time pastor should have for the congregation. The expectations include praying for the pastor, accept the pastor's leadership, care for the pastor and family, have realistic expectations, serve as ministers alongside the pastor, understand the pastor is part time, support the ministry with attendance and giving, prayerfully consider what is the most that they can pay their pastor. 

EMI was born from a desire to strategically blend design professions and faith in Christ to expand God's kingdom.

In 1981, a structural engineer chaperoned a youth group mission trip to Saipan. A typhoon had recently hit the island and he was able to help the missionaries by designing repairs to their damaged school. On the flight home, God gave a vision for mission that included design professionals and "Engineering Ministries International" was born. Bending the short-term mission model to suit architects and engineers was the seed idea which became EMI's global ministry.

Engineering Ministries International was incorporated in May of 1982 in Colorado, USA. The first design professional joined as full-time staff in 1984. During these formative years, volunteers began to participate in short-term trips that focused on design for ministries in developing countries. Since then, EMI worldwide has completed over 1,500 projects in more than 90 countries around the world.

Beginning in 1998, EMI USA sent its first staff member to live overseas and be a part of a local context. Today, EMI has over 150 staff and interns who serve in ten locations around the world.

Our deepest gratitude to Steve Lyons who has handled the payroll and associated tax reporting faithfully and well for many (15 plus) years. The "behind-the scenes" service of members like Steve is invaluable. Thank you, thank you. Your integrity in providing this longstanding service to the church family is much appreciated.

2023 Denominational Assessment

Each year we have to pay an assessment to the Reformed Church Classis of Delaware-Raritan. The cost for us in 2023 has been raised over 12% to \$100 per church member (that is \$7800 for the entire year for all of our members). What is this money used for? It covers the small overhead of the Classis, and helps with things like the seminary, minister support, and some mission work. Some church members choose to make a special offering to cover the cost of their assessment. Over the last three years, Clover Hill has received both pastoral and administrative support from the Classis.

Classis had originally planned to raise the denominational assessment to \$125 per member! It seems that they have been subsidizing the cost from member churches for a number of years and they now would like to have churches cover the true cost of their expenses.

Consequently, we can expect that there will be large increases over the next few years as

Consequently, we can expect that there will be large increases over the next few years as they gradually bring up the amounts paid by the member churches to fully cover their budget.

The cost of the denominational assessment is a large expense for our church - over 5% of our budgeted expenses! Some of you may even remember a time in our history when Clover Hill fell into arrears with Classis because we did not have the funds to pay our full assessment each year. Fortunately, we did catch up and now have a much better handle on keeping our income and expenses in line with each other.

In the past, many church members chose to make an annual gift to cover the cost of their denominational assessment. If you would like to do so, just note "assessment" on the memo line of your check or on the outside of an envelope and Thank You!

Budget Presentation

At the January Consistory meeting, the 2023 budget was approved and we held a congregational budget meeting on January 29th after church. A copy of the simplified budget is on the next page of the Belltower. If you would like to see the longer, more detailed copy of the budget, please contact the church office and we can email that to you.

Sincere thanks to Carol Levitt and to the members of the Stewardship Team for all of the time they've devoted to the preparation of this year's budget. The good work and good judgment that went into this document are evident.

Budget Summary:

- Overall, 2022 was a very encouraging year given our transitional state and the condition of the economy!
- CHRC finished with a surplus of \$968, partly because we did not have the costs associated
 with a Minister of Music on staff. We had budgeted that into 2022 and likely would have had
 a deficit if we had hired a new Minister of Music to a staff position. Our attributable gifts
 were also over \$3000 more than forecasted and more than collected for 2021, so that was
 another a very positive note which helped us finish the year with a surplus.
- For 2023, we have a very small deficit budgeted. We have included a line for the potential
 cost of a new Minister of Music position. And we are hopeful that gifts will exceed our
 pledges and our forecast again.
- Almost \$39,000 of Special Gift donations were given in memory of loved ones in 2022! These gifts directly increased our savings to over \$159,000.
- Beginning in 2023, we are committing to spend 5% of our pledged gifts on Mission Spending.
 This is a chance to do something positive with the savings that has accumulated over the last few years and to start helping those outside of the CHRC community.

Its seems like we were just waiting for the ball to drop, in Times Square to bring in the new year, 2023. Here we are beginning the "shortest" month of the year, yet it's a month full of holidays! On February 2 we'll celebrate Groundhog Day, February 14: Valentine Day, Feb 20: Presidents' Day, Feb 22: Ash Wednesday, Feb 27: Orthodox Christian beginning of Lent. February is Black History Month. February also happens to be American heart health month; a time when people can focus on their cardiovascular health. Sounds like a busy month.

Full disclosure: I take medication so that I don't have high blood pressure. Perhaps you have some heart issues that require medication, exercise, or restraint in your eating habits. However, as I was pondering what to write about this month, I thought about how each of these "holidays" deal with love, which we usually symbolize with the heart. "Love" of good weather, "love" of country, love of the paschal mystery, for which Lent prepares us.

I'll stick with Valentine Day and Ash Wednesday/Lent.

Valentine's Day. A celebration of love. Romantic love, yes, but also friendship, family, and community. It's light hearted. Pink and pretty and sweet. Maybe even a little indulgent.

Lent, by contrast, has more somber connotations. Ashes and dust, a humble reminder of our mortality and sin. Modeled after Jesus' forty days fasting in the wilderness, it's a season of preparation meant to cleanse the soul, humble the heart and discipline the body. It's a time to make less of ourselves.

These two very different holidays might not appear to have much in common and wouldn't normally be considered together. But at their core, they celebrate the same thing: love. Affectionate, passionate, sacrificial love, personified in the life and death and resurrection of Jesus.

The love of St. Valentine is affectionate, based on feelings and desire. The love of Lent is sacrificial, putting the needs of others above our own. The witness left to us in the Gospels of Mark and John show Jesus living out both of these loves. A person of action, undeterred from His mission to redeem people, moved by compassion.


So, if you're going to sacrifice something this Lent, may I suggest that you don't give up but rather give more. Give a little more time for prayer, scripture reading, meditation, etc. Give more time to serve others, especially the poor. If we really take this radical plunge during Lent, we'll understand better the depth of Jesus' love.

As the music minister, I'd be remiss if I didn't suggest that perhaps singing with the choir or playing an instrument for worship would be a great way to give more this Lent!
