Dear Clover Hill,



We are approaching my one year anniversary of being with you in this transition period. I continue to feel so grateful for this opportunity to walk beside you as you look forward to your future worship and work together.

This is the first time Clover Hill has engaged in an intentional "Interim" period. There are five traditional tasks of an Interim or Transition Period. They are:

- 1.Come to grips with history
- 2.Examine organizational needs
- 3. Strengthen denominational relationships
- 4. Discover who we are as a church
- 5.Look for and commit to a new future

I believe you did a lot of work with #1, Come to Grips with history, before I got here. #3, Strengthen denominational relationships, is and has always been strong. #4, Discover who we are as a church, has been the focus of this last year through the faithful work of the Search Team. And #5, Look for and commit to a new future is where we are about to go as the Search Team circulates the Pastor's position and they conduct interviews.

I left out #2, Examine organizational needs. The Consistory has begun this task and will continue to do so into this new year.

But there is one "task" that isn't laid out in the traditional tasks. An Interim pastor serves as a bridge from one season to another. I see my role as finding a way to move our congregation from who and what we were in our last season over a bridge to who and what God is calling us to be. To that end, it is important to tell you that it is my intention to be here until you have found your next pastor. Although I am on a "two year contract," my calling to you is to journey with you from past to future.

Here's to 2023! To growing together! To learning together! To loving together!

We have prepared a paper star with a word stuck on it. The words cover a range of meanings and are meant to help "guide" us in this next year.



Nominating Season Is Here!

In addition to an already busy season of holiday cheer, our nominating committee has been faithfully praying and asking people in the congregational to serve on Consistory. So many of you have served on Consistory at one time in the past. But what does serving on Consistory mean now?

There are three main responsibilities for Consistory members, both Elders and Deacons:

- 1. Attend Consistory meetings, on the 2nd Tuesday of the month from 7pm-8:30pm. At these meetings, we spend time praying for one another and our church. We discuss larger vision ideas. We try very hard not to do committee or team work at this meeting.
- 2. Serve as a Liaison or Leader of a Team. Our teams are Communication, Fellowship/Service, Spiritual Growth, Stewardship, Health and Safety, and possibly a new team called Pastoral Care.
- 3. Support the worship service by opening and closing. This is also done by the greater Consistory so that those serving on Consistory can focus on the first two responsibilities.

Search Team Update:

The year 2022 brought us a new search team, an transitional pastor, and expectations for the coming year.

The congregation took part in surveys and congregational meetings, and questionnaires. We had discussions, meetings, and even lunch, bringing us to a new year.

This year we have more expectations, the groundwork is done, the congregation has been heard, and we must address the mutual expectations of what will come next. During our research, the team was made aware that expectations are not one-sided. A pastor has expectations too. In our surveys, questions were asked and answered on what our expectations will be. What is the most important job of the Pastor? We had more than one answer. But the pastor candidate will have important questions, too, such as what we as a church can do for them. So, we all have expectations at this point in our New Year. We will pray for guidance on this journey just as a Pastor candidate will pray for theirs.

Stewardship Pledge Drive

Once again, the Stewardship Team is truly grateful for the dedication of our Clover Hill family in fulfilling their pledges. As we come to the end of 2022, we have had many followers send in gifts from both near and far. We wish everyone a New Year filled with good health and happiness! As of mid December, we have received 27 pledges for 2023, that is the same number as the previous year.

Budget Presentation

At the January 11th Stewardship Team meeting, we will be building the budget for 2023 using the pledges as a guideline for income. **We will have a presentation of the budget to the congregation on January 29, 2023** (details to follow).

2023 Denominational Assessment

Each year we have to pay an assessment to the Reformed Church Classis of Delaware-Raritan. What is this money used for? It covers the small overhead of the Classis, and helps with things like the seminary, minister support, and some mission work. Some church members choose to make an extra offering to cover the cost of their assessment. If you would like to do this, just mark your check "assessment" and it will help pay what we owe to Classis.

The cost for us in 2023 is \$100 per church member (that is \$11 more per member than the previous year). Classis actually proposed raising the assessment by \$36 per member! It seems that Classis has been subsidizing the assessments from churches and what has been paid has not actually covered the Classis budget. Consequently, we can expect that there will be larger increases over the next few years as they gradually bring up the amounts paid by the member churches to fully cover their budget. Clover Hill's total obligation to Classis will be \$7800 for 2023, a pretty large chunk of our own budget.

Final Deposit for 2022


The final deposit for 2022 giving was on December 28th. Any gift received after that date will be credited toward your 2023 gifts.



In 1877, Gerard Manley Hopkins, S.J. wrote a poem that begins: "The world is charged with the grandeur of God."

It's a wonderful declaration of the phenomenal and it's more astonishing because Hopkins suffered from depression. His life was a toil, full of disappointments. It wasn't always easy for him to see God's goodness in the world around him.

It can be that way, at times, for all of us.

I can think of no better time to look for God's grandeur, and to find it, than now; the start of a new year. You see that in all the news stories on January 1 that mention the first baby born in the new year.

But you could also see it New Year's Eve in the hundreds of thousands of people who huddled together in Times Square, shivering in the cold, waiting for that ball to drop, and waiting for history to be made, and waiting for a new number to be added to the calendar.

It's there in every horn that was blown, every explosion of confetti. It's loud and crazy, but it's our way of saying "We are alive. Despite all that's happened to us, and all that we've done wrong, and all that's gone right; we're starting a new year. We're beginning something new."

And I would add: we're able to do that because "the world is charged with the grandeur of God."

We need to be reminded of that. It's easy to miss, especially given the times in which we live. Foreclosures, recession, Covid, growing debt, the bloody battles underway in the world. It seems hopeless.

But then we look at the church season we're in, and we find hope.

Think about it: Mary was a woman who herself understood what it was like to live in an uncertain and frightening time. The Mother of God was forced, days after giving birth, to become a refugee, to save the life of her child. Yet she never abandoned hope. She never lost trust in God. As we begin this new year may we continue to trust in God.

The future is a clean page, an empty calendar, waiting to be written on. Everything is pure. Everything is possible.

New Year's Day is traditionally a day of beginnings, when resolutions are made. That treadmill you got for Christmas will get a work out – for a week or two. So will the diet... and the promise to stop smoking... and the vow you made to finally clean out the garage.

It all sounds good for a few days. But it's soon forgotten, or neglected.

But don't forget or neglect this beautiful reality: God's grandeur is with us, and among us. "The world IS charged with the grandeur of God." It's there in the bright light of every winter morning and the bright hope that's promised to us with the birth of the savior.

If you're going to make resolutions, resolve to live this year in that hope.

The choir will be back in action on January 8, 2023. Consider joining us in making it known that God's grandeur is with us, and among us!

The LORD bless you and keep you!


