What is your only comfort in life and in death?

That I am not my own, but belong—body and soul, in life and in death—to my faithful Savior, Jesus Christ... Because I belong to him, Christ, by his Holy Spirit, assures me of eternal life and makes me wholeheartedly willing and ready from now on to live for him.

Heidelberg Catechism

As we enter a new phase in church life, it is good to remember we are the Church. We belong to Christ; the Church belongs to Christ. This not only is the great “comfort in life and death,” but it is the freeing and empowering principle by which we are to live our lives. To belong to God means we are His children and stewards of both creation and the Gospel. One of the most important “commissioning” texts in the New Testament is when Christ put the “keys of the kingdom/ church” in the disciples/our hands (Matt 16:16-19). Though the meaning of this text is debated, at its most basic, Christ is calling us to be his hands and feet in the world and making us stewards of his work and message.

Interim periods are important times for congregations to remember that we are all called to minister in the name of Christ. There are many implications of this calling for Clover Hill Reformed Church at this current time, but here are a few we want to emphasize:

1. We are to love and care for each other as Jesus modeled in concrete acts of service; in a very real sense we are **stewards** of each other. Jesus states “A new commandment I give to you, that you love one another as I have loved you... by this everyone will know you are my disciples, if you have love for one another.” (John 13:34-35)
2. We are to provide for the spiritual nurture and care for the entire congregation through preaching, teaching, and pastoral care. This includes being good **stewards** of the places and spaces worship and discipleship occur. Jesus commands “Tend my sheep; feed my lambs” (John 21: 15-17).
3. The good news that God loves the world and has sent Christ not to condemn, but rather to redeem (John 3:16-17) is the primary reason for and mission of the Church in the world and why Clover Hill in particular exists on this hill. We are **stewards** of the Gospel of Christ in this community and beyond. Jesus proclaims “Peace be with you. As the Father has sent me, so I send you” (John 20:21).

We believe that interim does not mean wait. God has important work for Clover Hill Reformed Church to do now and that each of us has a part to play. Our stewardship emphasis this year is really an opportunity to renew, reflect and rejoice in our life in Christ.

Reflections on "Pulpit Supply"



Nancy Klima will be the designated registrar.

Registration will be at 1:30 PM and the walk starts at 2:00 PM. *This is a 3.0 mile loop from the church around Skillman Park, with a shorter alternate 1.5 mile loop.* There will be a water stop near the end. A telephone number will be provided at registration for you to call for a ride back if you are having difficulty.

People who sign up to walk solicit donations from themselves, their family, other congregation members, neighbors, etc. to sponsor them as walkers. 75% of the money collected goes to Church World Service and 25% for local programs. 25% is split between SHIP (Samaritan Homeless Interim Program) and the Somerset County Food Bank.

We will also collect tuna fish or other non-perishable food items for the Food Bank.

World Wide Communion Sunday October 7, 2018

Historically, the first Sunday in October is the time when we are most aware of the wideness of God's Kingdom as we recognize that the Sacrament of the Lord's Supper is being celebrated, on this day, in cathedrals, chapels and huts, in a variety of languages and liturgies – a singular tribute to the oneness of the church which is both the gift and the will of God.

Once again this year, the Consistory invites you to experience the fullness of God's family in this place, as the children will return from their classes, before the sacrament, to join their families. Those children who are of an age when they feel an interest in participating in the sacrament will be invited to do so, with their parents' permission and blessings, but we are primarily interested in being sure that all of the children are exposed to the liturgy and mystery of communion so that they begin to learn of this meal of remembrance, communion and hope.

We believe that this inclusive worship time will not only provide us with an intergenerational model for God's Kingdom, but will be of deep significance both educationally and liturgically in our ongoing Church life, bringing special blessings to us all.

Greeters


Dear Clover Hill Church Family,

Sunday or Other Day School



As many of you know, for the past several years, we have been using a new Sunday School curriculum assembled for us by Marilyn Fineman. As reviewed by our teachers, these lesson materials are superior to any of the publishers' products we had purchased in the past and are designed to take our children through many of the best known Bible stories in a two year cycle. This curriculum ensures that our children are exposed to these important lessons, but it does not follow the common lectionary, the source for the scripture readings in worship each week. Because both the children's bulletins distributed at the door each Sunday and the children's sermon were drawn from the common lectionary, this resulted in a disconnect between what the children heard in the children's sermon and the lesson presented when they were dismissed to their classes. Beginning this fall, the children's sermon leads into the Bible story that is being presented as part of the Sunday School lesson that day. And the children's bulletins also reflect the Sunday School lesson. The children are being dismissed to their classes before the first scripture reading in the sanctuary and return to the sanctuary at the end of the hymn following the sermon. While this shortens the instructional time in Sunday School, it is hoped that having the children return to the sanctuary will give them greater exposure to the liturgy, including the offertory and prayers.

Also new this fall, in an effort to accommodate as many families as possible, we are offering a **"weeknight Sunday School."** The Sunday morning lesson or lessons are being presented, together with a related craft or activity and song, in a 40 minute format. This weeknight program is geared toward our school-aged children (K-7th grade), but older or younger family members are welcome, too. This weeknight program will be offered once or twice a month to give families with Sunday morning scheduling conflicts an opportunity to participate in the Christian education program on a day and time that might better fit their schedules. Families are invited and encouraged to participate in the weeknight program for the sports season or during play practice or perhaps throughout the school year.

Once families have their fall calendars in hand, we'll schedule our October sessions. We'll be revisiting and revising as we go, so comments, questions and suggestions always are welcome.
